## **New York State Outdoor Burn Ban**

The outdoor burn ban is in effect from **March 16- May 14**. Open burning is prohibited in NYS, with several exceptions:

- Camp fires or any other outdoor fires less than 3 feet in height and 4 feet in length, width or diameter are allowed;
- Small cooking fires are allowed;
- Ceremonial or celebratory bonfires are allowed. Disposal of flags or religious items in a small-sized fire is allowed, if it is not otherwise prohibited by law or regulation;
- Only charcoal or dry, clean, untreated or unpainted wood can be burned;
  Fires cannot be left unattended and must be fully extinguished;
- Open burning is the single greatest cause of wildfires in New York State.

Since the spring burn ban was implemented in 2009, the number of <u>wildfires</u> has decreased by more than 40%. For more information on the burn ban, please visit <u>DEC's website</u>.
